 - Group 1: Videos & Podcasts
 - HeartWired: Supporting SE development; love the playlists to make the connection to the foundation that SE is in our work.
 - Meaningful Moments: IMH; conversations with professionals and families for how to support everyone's mental health; "bites" in social media are helpful; Lisa sees ways she can use these with families especially postpartum and self-blame that families may be experiencing; great for PD as folks are driving between visits
 - Suggestion - playlist with just clips less than 4 min or so.
 - Group 2: Webinars & Workshops
 - ElevatED EI: Robin is interested in how some of this could be made available to families; Could these be made into shorter bites, esp Pyramid Model ones? Confusing for how to access - "more information" isn't intuitive (UX)
 - Talks on Tuesdays: Virginia shares with students - happy to see suspension and expulsion ToT;

 - Learning Bytes (how to train on a topic): Valuable for staff meetings with ready made PD/trainings within pre-existing meets; Lisa Terry's email address is on these in case anyone has a recommendation or specific questions about the Learning Bytes

- Learning Paths (self-selected “paths” on a topic): Ana’s team recently used the sensory disabilities pathway in a flexible way; the resources and updates are fantastic. Really good feedback from those who went back and did the path on their own.
- Suggestions for new resources:
 - SE Development:
 - Jessica’s area has been looking for a rich SE training; right now teams are often looking at atypical development which can become our “typical”; historically used the old child indicators booklet - something like this would be wonderful to use along with the pathway. Need something more foundational on general and typical SE development.
 - Ana: Old indicators booklet gave good, rich understanding of what SE development should look like at each age; still a great resource
 - Neuroaffirming practices
 - How about a learning byte of Neuroaffirming Practices or What encompasses Neurodiversity.
