Characteristics Commonly Seen as autism:

Educational Impact	Explain that specific types of sup- port may be necessary to help the child be successful in the classroom. This does not mean they will not be able to learn and improve their academic skills.	"A child's current communication skills are resulting in an educa- tional impact because she does not speak aloud or vocalize in the classroom. The teacher now gives her a block to place on the numbers as the teacher says them aloud. The child is then able to correctly identify the numbers."
Red Flags	Explain that certain behaviors may lead us to explore wheth- er their child has certain needs related to a diagnosis.	"Signs" "Indications" "Characteristics"
Percent Delay	Explain that this helps providers know how much support may be needed in a particular area by better understanding the child's current skills in comparison to their age.	"A child requires moderate sup- port with gross motor skills com- pared to what is expected for his age since he is still crawling."
Areas of Deficit	Explain that this means either their child's performance in a cer- tain area may need more support compared to either their child's performance in other areas or in comparison to what we would expect for their age."	"Areas requiring additional support""A child has strong play skills with toys, but an area of need is interacting with other children while playing."

Tips for Providers

Open Dialogue

Try to make it a conversation (Give opportunities to pause and for the family to ask questions).

Highlight Positives

Highlight the child's strengths OR what the parents report to admire about their child.

Use Specific Examples

Give examples of concerns your team observed during the assessment (e.g.: behaviors, regressions, atypical development).

Support Findings

Use evidence-based resources or have materials handy to support the facts you are about to share (POSI Score).

Listen and Watch

Take into consideration the parent's verbal/non- verbal cues to make a judgement call on how to proceed.

Encourage

Encourage the parent to talk with their developmental pediatrician(since we do not diagnose) for further evaluation.

<u>Remind</u>

Remind the parents that the El team is here to support their child and family through this process.
