

Help Us Ensure Virginia's Infants & Toddlers are Receiving the Early Intervention Services They Need

Background

- The number of infants and toddlers served in Virginia has increased 36% from State Fiscal Year (SFY) 07 to SYF–11
- Virginia's Federal and State allocations have not changed to reflect the increased number of children that are being found eligible for early intervention services.
- Systems are at risk of having waiting lists for services and are out of Federal Compliance, jeopardizing Federal funding.
- Virginia's Early Intervention system has at least an \$8 million deficit for FY13. This deficit will continue increase as the number of children needing services continues to grow.

When Your Child & Family are Receiving Early Intervention Services, You Have Rights & SafeGuards

- If your child has been referred to your local early intervention program your child has the right to receive an evaluation to determine if they are eligible and a right to the development of an Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) within *forty-five (45) calendar days* from when you contacted the local system.
- Your child has a right to receive the services on your IFSP.
- Your child has the right to receive each early intervention service in *natural environments* to the extent appropriate to meet your child's developmental needs.

If Your Rights are Being Violated

Contact your local system manager and The Infant and Toddler Connection of Virginia with a written complaint.

A written complaint includes:

- Your name and contact information
- Where you child receives or should receive early intervention services
 (locality)
- · How your family's rights are being violated
