









Early Intervention Eligibility

- Developmental Delay
 - At Least 25% delay in one area
- Atypical Development
 - Sensory-motor
 - Social emotional
 - Behaviors
 - Social, language plus behavior
- Diagnosed Condition

















Early Childhood Special Education begins serving eligible children when they are 2 by September 30th or on their third birthday.

Non- Negotiable		Negotiable
	Notification is considered the referral	
	Required unless parent opts out	
	Includes name, birthdate and parent contacts	
	Includes Service Coordinator's name	
	LEA staff designated to receive the notification	
	Receipt starts the 65 day timeline	
	Method notification is sent	
	Receipt of notifications during holidays and school breaks	

NOTIFICATION cont.		
Non-Negotiable	Negotiable	
Notification is also a referral.	Notification may include service coordinator's name and contact information and the language(s) spoken by the child and family.	
Notification/referral is required if child is potentially eligible for Part B unless the parent opts out .	The person who sends the notification and the person who receives the notification/referral at the LEA is to be determined.	
Notification/referral must include child's name, date of birth, and parent contact information	How the information will be sent to the LEA is to be determined.	
65-day timeline to the begins when notification/referral is received.		
Staff vacation, staff work schedule, breaks (e.g., summer) cannot delay receipt		

TRANSITION CONFERENCE

Non- Negotiable		Negotiable
	Held between 9 months and 90 days from anticipated date of transition.	
	Parent must approve conference.	
	A representative from the local school division must participate.	
	LEA representative may participate face to face or by teleconference or videoconference.	
	Who serves as Local School System representative.	

TRANSITION CONFERENCE cont.

	Non-Negotiable	Negotiable
	Must be at least 90 days and can be up to 9 months before child's anticipated date of transition.	LEA may send any staff that are familiar with the ECSE program and can explain the program to the family
1	Transition Conference is required, with parent approval, if child is potentially eligible for Part B.	While a face to face meeting is preferred, participation by teleconference and/or videoconference is acceptable.
	Must include Part C representative, LEA representative, and family.	

PART B ELIGIBILITY DETERMINATION

Non- Negotiable		Negotiable
	Parents must be invited to eligibility determination meetings.	
	Part C may be invited to the meeting.	
	If a child is eligible for Part C they will automatically be eligible for Part B.	
	If a child is referred to Part C between 45 and 90 days of being age eligible for Part B, Part C and Part B may conduct eligibility evaluations together.	
	LEAs have 65 business days to determine eligibility.	

PART B ELIGIBILITY DETERMINATION cont.		
Non-Negotiable	Negotiable	
Membership at eligibility meetings includes special education teacher, *general education representative, an individual who can interpret the instructional implications of evaluations, and a representative of the LEA. Parents must be invited.	Part C may be invited to the meeting.	
LEAs have 65 business days to determine eligibility.	The child must meet requirements of a child with a disability in at least one of the 13 disability categories, demonstrate significant impairment in participation <i>in age appropriate</i> <i>activities</i> , and require special education services. Part C has different eligibility criteria.	
	If child is referred to Part C between 45 and 90 days prior to being eligible to receive services from the LEA, with parental permission, LEA and Part C may conduct eligibility evaluations together.	

IEP DEVELOPMENT

Non- Negotiable		Negotiable
	Parents must be invited to IEP meetings.	
	Parents must sign IEP before it can be implemented or changed.	
	Part C may be invited to the meeting.	
	The IEP must be written within 30 calendar days from the eligibility determination meeting.	
	Start date for the IEP

	Non-Negotiable	Negotiable
i e L S I r	Membership at IEP meetings ncludes teachers (special education, general education), an individual who can nterpret the instructional implications of evaluations, and a representative of the LEA. Parents must be invited and meeting scheduled at mutually agreed upon time. f they are unable to attend, they must give permission before IEP can be mplemented or changed.	Part C may be invited to the meeting.
	EP must be written within 30 calendar days from the eligibility meeting.	Start date can be flexible but within a reasonable amount of time (example: IEP may be written in June to start the first day of school)
